

Longlands Lake Restoration project gets underway!

What's happening on site NOW?

Thanks to funding from Sellafield Ltd, West Cumbria Rivers Trust are making improvements to the Longlands Lake area. Starting on Tuesday 8th December and running for 4 days we will be working on the following:

- Making improvements to the very muddy path that runs parallel with the River Ehen
- Creating an "Access for All" education and wildlife area

Further site works on site in 2021 & 2022 will include:

- Improved public seating/ benches/ picnic area
- Interpretation, signage and wildlife trails
- Repairs to the boat ramp/ landing area
- River bank stabilisation works to stop the large area of bank erosion on the River Ehen that is undermining the footpath around the lake, and the lake itself

Community activities/ workshops in 2021 & 2022 will include:

- Creating a living willow hide/ sculpture
- Invasive species management (Balsam Bashing & Japanese knotweed treatment)
- Forest Schools, Eco Therapy & Green Gyms
- Angling taster sessions
- Wildlife workshops
